

Re-homing your own cat direct, with our help:-

If you do not wish to re-home you're **neutered** cat, in the first instance, into a cat rescue's cat shelter, as they aren't really a home from home or they are full to bursting and/or you have tried all the cat rescues in your own area, then this maybe for you?

Re-homing your cat directly from yourself, with our help of course. Through our own web site and others. That we know of and use frequently, too.

Some great advantages of this is that you know exactly who and where your cat is going to. It can also be a lot better for your cat. The less stressful moves the better for them too. Also being in another home, home environment, instead of a cattery/shelter situation for a while. That is far from a normal home environment for many cats, believe me. Until a new home is found is sometimes more conducive for all concerned. Especially the cat.

Firstly, please remember when re-homing you're cat to include the following details, in preferably a word document and e-mail it to admin@catactiontrust.co.uk for homing you're cat direct. That we can simply copy and paste, hopefully. Including a photo of your cat, as this can really help too:-

Description:-

Make it a lovely/encouraging description of your cat, cats age, colour, sex, where they are, whether they need access to outside or are completely indoor cats only. Are they good with other cats, dogs or children(older, smaller) or not. Whether they are neutered, fully vaccinated or I.D. chipped, your best contact details(so they can contact you),etc.

- For example:- "Snowball" – an exceptionally friendly and laid back, long-haired, white with black, male, cat of about 2 yrs old. Neutered, fully vaccinated and I.D. chipped. He can use a cat flap. Good with children of 5+ and OK with other cats. For a home with direct access to a garden, eventually. In Lanark. Please remember, you can tell a lot, by asking the right questions to a new potential owner. If you are not fully happy with the potential new owners, please do not home your cat to them.

Also if this is not working for you and you're cat and you would prefer you're cat to go into a cat shelter environment for homing instead eventually. Then please contact your local cat rescues instead and let us know(admin@catcactiontrust.co.uk) to delete your cat details from our database if the cat is being homed by others or has been homed.

We have no problem in helping to re-homing you're cat direct, for you and will do this for you only, when we have all the details of the cat, to hand. Just e-mail(admin@catactiontrust.co.uk) us a good description of your cat, as described above, with a contact nos./e-mail address that you frequent use, etc. Also a picture of you're cat for re-homing really can help.

Also we also ask that once the cat is re-homed successfully, that you let us know, to

delete their details from our and others databases, ASAP. Saving needless calls, at a later date for you and possibly us.

When we try to help to home your cat direct. We do advertise your cat for homing direct on our web site and www.catchat.co.uk. Sometimes(space permitting), we can also put a weekly add in the Airdrie and Coatbridge Advertiser too.

Other web sites, that we know of, but **do not** currently put your cats details on are:- www.pets4homes.co.uk, www.adtrader.co.uk, www.giveusahome.co.uk. So if you wish them on these too. Please arrange this yourself.

If we have helped you in this way to re-home your cat and you are very thankful. For the voluntary service, we have provided, in this instance. Then you might wish to think of giving us a donation, for our efforts. To help the cats we currently have in care(see our web site for these details) and so we can effectively help more cats, in need out there.....

As we are a totally voluntary service, run by volunteers and we do not get any public funding at all. We purely survive by getting donations from the public out there, to help pay our vets, food bills and to keep our cat shelters still open and maintained.
