

Help and advice for re-homing your cat(s).

- If you wish our help with re-homing your cat(s) and are in the Lanarkshire area especially or in Scotland and able to travel to our fosterers based in Lanark, Airdrie or East Kilbride. Wishing your cat to come into one of our cat shelters. Please phone 01555-660784(leave a message if needbe) or better still e-mail lynne@catactiontrust.co.uk for our help/advice, space availability and e-mailing you a list of other cat rescues, that we know of(some of which maybe closer to you too and more able to help you!).

Our primary responsibility for re-homing someone's cat, is firstly to the cats in the Lanarkshire area. However, in saying that, from time to time, we do and can help outwith this boundary area(shelter space permitting). Especially with small kittens, from anywhere that's feasible and possible. That we can maybe be able to squeeze in, or make space available elsewhere. Even when cat shelters are full at times.....

- However, if you wish help with re-homing your cat(s) and are wishing cat shelter space for your cat, but outwith Lanarkshire or cannot travel to us in Airdrie, Lanark or East Kilbride. But you are still in Scotland. We can e-mail you a list of other Scottish cat rescues. That probably will be nearer to you. They may also be able to put people in contact with you, if interested, in your cat and haven't got space at that time. Please e-mail lynne@catactiontrust.co.uk requesting a list of other cats rescue organisations, that maybe be able help instead and may even be closer to you too!!

Please remember when re-homing your cat, cat rescues will require the following details:-

Cats age, colour, sex, about their temperament, where they are, whether they need access to outside or not. Good with other cats, dogs or children. Whether they are neutered, vaccinated or chipped, etc.

- Alternatively, If you do not wish to re-home your cat, in the first instance, into a cat rescues' cat shelter and wish help to re-home your cat directly from yourself. So you know exactly who and where they are going to. It can also be better for the cat. The less stressful moves the better for them too. Also being in another home environment, instead of a cattery situation for a while, until a new home is found is sometimes more conducive for all concerned.

These are also other preferable options available to you. Than trying to get a cat rescue to take your cat.....Trying to find a home for your cat direct??:-

1. You can try and advertise your cats locally through local supermarkets, pet shops and vets. Please remember when re-homing your cat to include the following details:- a lovely description of your cat, cats age, colour, sex, where they are, whether they need access to outside or indoor cats only. Good with other cats, dogs or children. Whether they are neutered, vaccinated or chipped, etc. If you are not happy with the potential new owners do not home your cat to them.
2. You can try and advertise your cats in the cat section of the adtrader paper. It's free and you can include a picture when advertising online. See www.adtrader.co.uk or phone 01698-573000. Please remember when re-homing your cat to include the following details:- a lovely description of your

cat, cats age, colour, sex, where they are, whether they need access to outside or indoor cats only. Good with other cats, dogs or children. Whether they are neutered, vaccinated or chipped, etc. If you are not happy with the potential new owners do not home your cat to them.

3. We can help to re-home your cat, through our homing direct scheme on this web site. Wherever you are. Whereby you e-mail lynne@catactiontrust.co.uk all your cats details(age, colour, sex, about their temperament, where they are, whether they need access to outside or not. Good with other cats, dogs or children. Whether they are neutered, vaccinated or chipped, etc) and requesting for them to be put on to our web site for homing direct. Maybe also a picture really helps of the cat(s) you wish to re-home. We will then arrange for your cat to be put on our web site for homing direct with your own tel. no. and e-mail address. Also we will actively promote them for homing, when people contact us, over the phone, looking for a cat too. In return for this we ask that you just phone(01555-660784) or e-mail us back saying when the cat has been homed and we will delete the cat off our web site and stop putting people on to you that we think is a good match. Also a donation from yourselves, to us, in these circumstances, for our efforts and help, would not go amiss. See our direct debit instruction for our bank details, where you can make a one off bank transfer via your bank or regular payments into our bank account by completing this direct debit instruction. Especially if we have helped directly to home your cat(s). As we are all volunteers, getting no public funding and trying our best for all the cats out there. If you are not happy with the potential new owners do not home your cat to them.
- Alternatively our main Original Cat Action Trust HQ's maybe able to help you also with cats. If you are requiring help outwith Scotland especially or still require more cat rescue contacts. Than we have e-mailed to you on our cat rescue contact sheet. Then please e-mail
